Volunteer Home Care Lay Assessors

RSVP West retire into action







Lay Assessors are part of a team visiting people in their homes who have home care services, to talk to them and find out if the quality of the service is satisfactory. The Lay Assessors pass on these views to Bristol City Council staff - this enables them to monitor the quality of home care and to take up any problems with the agencies providing the care.

Working with Bristol City Council

Council staff undertake checks to find out the quality of the home care service they commission and they investigate poor care.

The RSVP Lay Assessor scheme works in partnership with the council.

Home Care is vitally important

The people that need carers to come into their homes are mostly older, frail and can be in very poor health. For most, the carers are their lifeline.

Many are isolated and very vulnerable and therefore find it hard to complain or sort out problems with their care arrangements.

Why should I become a Lay Assessor?

You will be supporting the most vulnerable people in the community by making sure their voices are heard so that they can remain in their own homes for as long as they are able.

You will be taking on a role which will be both interesting and rewarding.

Who are we looking for?

We are looking for people with good communication skills, and who are flexible and organised. You will need to enjoy team working but able to work on your own initiative and not be judgemental.
